Overview

Over four enriching days exploring the historical marvels of Jodhpur and Jaisalmer, our group delved into a captivating blend of cultural immersion, historical significance, and industrial innovation. The journey kicked off with a poignant visit to the Jaisalmer War Museum, where the sacrifices of war heroes were honored, followed by a serene evening at Gadi Saar lake. Day 2 unfolded within the ancient walls of Jaisalmer Fort, exploring its narrow lanes, visiting the Jain Temple, and culminating in a mesmerizing camel safari through the Thar Desert. The day concluded with traditional Rajasthani dance and a lively DJ night at the Desert Camp. Day 3 led us on a haunting exploration of the Ghost Village, steeped in 13th-century history, before returning to Jodhpur, where the bustling market and a seamless check-in at Nirali Dhani hotel added vibrant cultural touches. Day 4 unfolded with a sumptuous breakfast, leading to the grandeur of Umaid Bhawan Palace, Mehrangarh Fort, and a unique exploration of industrial processes at Kansara Modular Ltd. and Saras dairy facility. Each day contributed to a nuanced understanding of Rajasthan's heritage, leaving a lasting imprint of the region's history, culture, and progress on our collective memory.

Day 1: 11th December 2023

The tour began on 10th December 2023, all the students assembled at Bandra Terminus to board train to Jodhpur, reached Jodhpur on 11th December 2023. After a good breakfast on a cold winter morning, the students proceeded towards Jaisalmer by bus.



The fun trip began with the prestigious Jaisalmer War Museum being the first spot to be visited. Jaisalmer War Museum was established to honour the contributions and sacrifices of war heroes. These soldiers fought valiantly in some of the most challenging battles in history. Conceived by Lieutenant General Bobby Mathews and cultivated by the Indian Army's Desert Corps, the Museum was opened for public viewing in 2015 by Lieutenant General Ashok Singh. Since Jaisalmer had a history of facing long stretches of wars, including the Laungewala Battle, it was chosen as a suitable location for the Museum. The Museum displays collections from these wars including equipment, armour, weapons, vehicles and more.


Some prominent exhibits in the Museum include war trophies, vintage equipment, tanks such as the T 55 Tank, and military vehicles, apart from murals of soldiers and Indian Army strategies from the Indo-Pakistan War of 1971. With its sleek lines and glass façade, the Jaisalmer War Museum is an outstanding example of contemporary architecture. The museum also includes an Honour Wall displaying and honouring names of Paramvir Chakra and Mahavir Chakra holders.





Post the visit to the Jaisalmer War Museum, the students headed to the benchmark of the Jaisalmer City – the Gadi Sagar Lake which is an artificial lake in Jaisalmer, Rajasthan. It was built by the founder of Jaisalmer, King Rawal Jaisal in 1156 AD and later rebuilt by Gadsi Singh Bhati. The lake is said to be at one point in time, the only source of water for the city dwellers. The lake basks in its natural splendor and is definitely exploring. While some students enjoyed their time boating with the breathtaking view of the Jaisalmer Fort in the backdrop, other opted for shopping for collecting the souvenirs of this royal city.





Day 2: 12th December 2023

The day commenced with a delightful breakfast at Hotel Desert Palace, setting the tone for a day of exploration and cultural immersion. Post breakfast, the journey began as the enthusiastic students departed from the hotel, eager for a day of discovery in the enchanting city of Jaisalmer.

The first destination was the iconic Jaisalmer Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a testament to the city's rich history. Constructed in 1156 AD by Rawal Jaisal, the fort is renowned for its yellow sandstone architecture and intricate carvings. The students immersed themselves in the historical charm of Jaisalmer Fort, navigating through its

narrow lanes and uncovering the stories concealed within its walls. Within the fort, the students paid a visit to the Jain Temple, an architectural masterpiece known for its intricate marble carvings and ancient significance as a place of worship. Ascending to the fort's summit, they were rewarded with a breathtaking panoramic view of Jaisalmer, providing insights into the city's layout and historical evolution. The fort's bustling market offered a variety of traditional Rajasthani handicrafts and souvenirs, allowing us to indulge in a bit of local shopping.



The students savored the flavors of authentic Rajasthani cuisine in a charming setting for their luncheon followed by a visit to the Bada Bagh, a serene garden complex with royal cenotaphs, commissioned by Maharawal Jait Singh in the 16th century. This architectural masterpiece stands as a tribute to the rulers of Jaisalmer and showcases impressive Rajput architecture. The cenotaphs, or chhatris, commemorate the legacy of the city's leaders, creating a peaceful atmosphere amidst the desert landscape.

The students arrived at the desert camp in the early evening that marked the beginning of their desert adventure, promising an evening filled with unique experiences. Embarking on a camel safari, the students traversed the golden dunes of the Thar Desert, appreciating the

mesmerizing landscape as the sun began to set. Camel safaris have been an integral part of Rajasthan's cultural heritage, providing a traditional mode of transport through the vast desert expanse for centuries.

Upon our return to the camp, a traditional Rajasthani welcome awaited the students, setting the stage for an evening of cultural festivities. The desert camp came alive with traditional Rajasthani dance performances, complemented by a lively DJ night, creating a vibrant atmosphere of celebration. The day concluded with a delightful dinner, featuring a diverse array of Rajasthani dishes, allowing us to savor the culinary delights of the region.
